

TOWN BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT:

Supervisor Walters comments that he received a call from the Lakeview Athletics Association inquiring on the status of the Town paving the parking lot. They did discuss it previously but a decision was not made. Paving season is starting soon as well as baseball season. The funding is available but part of it is on private property.

Walt Rooth comments that he could put together an agreement for the next Board meeting.

The Town Board discusses whether or not to approve this.

The Town Board agrees that the parking lot should be paved and an agreement should be drawn up by the Town Attorney.

Supervisor Walters comments that last fall they talked about putting the ambulance service out to bid in 2014 to be accepted at the Reorganizational meeting of 2015. The RFP should be put out within the next couple of months.

Walt Rooth comments that he will look into that.

Councilman Quinn comments that he spoke to a local Volunteer Fire Company that wanted to offer that service.

Supervisor Walters responds that when the RFP comes out, He doesn't see why they couldn't submit a bid.

The Town Board discusses whether there is a need for appointing a full time Dog Control Officer and whether there is money in the budget.

Councilman Quinn comments that they could potentially make him an Animal Control Officer in the future, however, that would require further training.

Councilwoman Potter-Juda comments that she feels there is a need because several Police Officers have been bitten while picking up stray dogs. West Seneca and Lackawanna have a full time Dog Control Officer and they are smaller than the Town of Hamburg. She spoke with Personnel and Finance to obtain the cost to fund this position and she feels that the money is available in the Budget.

Supervisor Walters disagrees and states that they have had a part-time Dog Control Officer for several years and doesn't feel there is a need for a full time position. He disagrees that the money is available because this full time position was not funded in the 2014 Budget.
