Reports from Town Board Members and Department Heads

Councilman Best comments that he attended numerous Memorial Day Events, thanked the Service Men and Woman who gave the ultimate sacrifice and commented that the events were well attended. The opening of the Village of Hamburg playground was also well attended and they did a phenomenal job.

Councilman Quinn adds that he was in attendance as well and concurs with Councilman Best.

Supervisor Walters – no report

Marty Denecke, Director of Youth, Recreation and Senior Services, reports that the Youth Bureau received a \$10,000 grant from Erie County for their summer mentoring program. For the Recreation Department, at the end of this month on June 26th the summer programs will be starting and registration is still open. Check the website or call the office for more information. Senator Jacobs is doing a Health fair at the Senior Services Center on June 30th that's open to the public. Senior service's has numerous programs starting.

Sean Crotty, Public Safety, thanked the Board for the opportunity to hire Alleen Mason. He also attended the National Homeland Security Conference in Buffalo and made some great contacts on behalf of Mr. McKendry concerning the crude oil and train traffic moving through the area. We are working on bringing more training to our first responders and in addition they have completed the tower in the parking lot.

Business from the Floor

John McKendry, refers to a report on the number of Bakken oil trains observed at the Depew Amtrak Station in August 2015 were 107 tankers and in 2017 were 224 tankers which has doubled. This is something the Town should keep an eye on. Concerning the Quiet Zones, new trains are moving through with different tones and noise levels, and on Saturday they were blowing their horns all day long. Someone needs to call CSX to inquire when the new crossing will be installed. He wanted to commend the Police Chief on the traffic patrol and thank them for their phenomenal job. He also believes Route 5 needs sidewalks.

Councilman Quinn, comments that by the Pleasant Avenue train tracks there was paint on the ground and CSX trucks are over there.

Mike Quinn, Engineering Consultant, responds they're doing some pavement work around the tracks, but it has nothing to do with the Quiet Zones.

Ted Casey, Traffic Safety Coordinator, questions the appropriateness and timing of signs that read simply "Town of Hamburg Highway Improvement Project Tom Best Highway Superintendent". He's requesting that these signs be removed. He further states that the signs are not consistent with the Town Board's requirements that any traffic related signage be approved via resolution and there's no resolution for these signs.

Councilman Best, asks where are the signs?

Mr. Casey responds one on Howard Road and one at the Hamburg Town Beach.

A resident states that there are two at the Hamburg Golf Course as well.

Highway Superintendent Best responds that Mr. Casey has no idea what he's talking about and they're informational signs to notify residents of Howard Road to keep their cars off the road because they will be working in that area.

Don Wiess comments that trains have to blow their whistles for numerous reasons and he's glad the work on the tracks is coming to an end. As far as the signs go he questions the size limit of signs in the town.

Councilman Best responds that's for political signs.

Kurt Allen, Building Inspector, responds the signs are informational signs and not political signs.

Councilman Best, comments that signs at other parks throughout Erie County list other elected officials names on them.

Highway Superintendent Best then comments that it's been common practice to have similar signs with any new construction and there's been one at the Dog Park for years. The signs do not block traffic and are strictly informational.

Dennis Chapman comments that his neighbors haven't complained about the signs and are happy the work is getting done over on Howard Road.

Dennis Gaughan comments that he lives near the railroad tracks on Cloverbank Road in Briercliff. He then thanks John McKendry, Donald Wiess, and Lynn Dixon for their efforts in making the Briercliff subdivision very quiet now. He feels it has increased the value of his property and hopes the Town Board will give the same benefits to the other railroad crossings throughout the Town.

Theresa Ferraro questions the Board regarding the pool whether the Board has had contact with the Frontier School Board since April's meeting.

Supervisor Walters responds they wouldn't do that until there was a determination on moving forward with the project.

Theresa Ferraro questions if the Engineering Department has done the feasibility study regarding the pool.

Mike Quinn, Engineering Consultant, states the study of the building and the facility with the pool has been completed and submitted to the Town Board for the Board to consider. In summary there's not a lot of work that needs to be done to the pool and everything is in really good shape. The Town does a really nice job taking care of the pool. It has now been deferred to the Town Board for the next move regarding the pool.

Councilman Best responds a discussion will be held with this current Town Board or the new Town Board in January whether the Town will do it or not.

Theresa Ferraro questions will the report (study) be open to the public.

Councilman Best responds that a Foil Request would have to be done and they are available in the Town Clerks office.

Supervisor Walters responds to a question regarding the expansion of the current Senior Center stating until there's a project to be presented to the Town Board they would not reach out to the Frontier Board of Education. The next question was whether a report was completed, reviewed, and what the outcome of said report was. Per our Town Engineer he stated the facility was not in bad shape, and would not take much to fix up some of the deficiencies that are in the facility. The Town Engineer also made a point to say he was evaluating the condition and not the size of the facility.

Councilman Best comments that the Town is in a lease to own agreement with the Frontier School District on the Senior Center located on Southwestern Boulevard. In order to do any changes within it the Town has approval, but to add on to that building we'd have to get permission. The technical owners of that building are Frontier Central School District, so the answer is the Town Board has to analyze and discuss what they are going to do with the study that was completed by GHD Engineering.

Elsie Kelly questions the condition of the pool and if there have been any studies done regarding the size of the pool and is it adequate for the needs of the senior citizens of Hamburg.

Mike Quinn, Engineering Consultant, responds No to the question regarding that type of study.

Elsie Kelly comments maybe the study should be done.

Councilman Best responds that the Recreation Department has advised the Board, in a report, that there are several classes and times available and it seems like residents like to go at certain times where the pool is very full and other times it is very empty.

Elsie Kelly responds that a class that is considered empty would be maybe 14 people in the pool which is all it holds. The class that's full is 22 people and it's like you're in a can of sardines and

you can't move. More people would come if there was room to move in the pool, and if the dressing room was larger. She believes the space problem needs to be addressed.

Councilman Quinn responds that it sounds like a scheduling problem and asks Marty to look into any scheduling deficiencies.

Marty Denecke responds that Senior Services has those attendance figures. He does not have those figures with him now, but will look into it.
