Kurt Allen, Building Inspector explains the background of a complaint his office received regarding the height of a foundation at 4900 Bernadette Ave. The Building Department then did an investigation. A stop work order was then issued. An amended grading plan was then submitted and he believes it has not been adhered to to date.

The Town Board, the Building Inspector, and representatives from David Home’s discuss in depth the issues and background of the approved plan regarding drainage, grading and the height of the foundation located at 4900 Bernadette Avenue.

Supervisor Walters concludes that he will have a meeting with Kurt Allen and Mike Quinn, Engineering Consultant, this week and will try to come up with a solution.
